Nominees are asked to complete an application outlining their educational and career history, professional and community involvement, corporate and nonprofit board memberships and mentoring experience. They also are encouraged to submit one letter of recommendation from someone who is familiar with their accomplishments professionally, in the community and through mentoring.

A panel of judges comprised of business professionals and past Top 100 Women winners from throughout Maryland review all of the applications submitted, narrowing the list to select the Top 100 Women. This year, 63 women are first-time recipients.
